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SUMMARY

Known since 1992 for creating hard-edge, figurative-abstract paintings with written social commentaries, called "Verdadism." Born in the Harlem section of New York City; currently lives in New Jersey, near Philadelphia. Self-employed, since 1986, as the owner of Persona, a boutique art and design studio. For three consecutive years (2008, 2009, 2010), chosen by the Department of State as one of the 15 most prominent Hispanic-Americans shaping the U.S. cultural scene. In a Huffington Post Latino Voices' 2013 article, named among "10 of the best Latino Artists in U.S." Recognized for creating paintings that address issues of sexism, racism, stereotyping and universal social themes in an effort to promote tolerance and social justice. Has been featured in magazines and newspapers, radio and television; Verdadism paintings have been used on the covers and pages of academic and scholarly books. In 1999 wrote book on the Art of Verdadism, "Soraida's Verdadism: The Voice of a Puerto Rican Woman on Canvas; Unique Controversial Images and Style. From 1996 to 1999, served as a member of the New Jersey State Council on The Arts; also participated in a think tank for modernizing the Trenton State Museum in New Jersey. Social advocate who visits young children in schools to encourage and inspire them to strive to achieve their fullest potential; conducts Verdadism Art talks and Exhibitions at colleges and universities. In 2008, opened the Verdadism Art Gallery.
